2.	Matters Arising	(i) Draft Moray Compact – Fabio Villani The Draft Compact has been circulated and is currently out for consultation; closing date for comments is 29 February 2016. The information can be found <a href="here">here</a> .	
		The Compact has been presented at a recent Moray Federation of Community Halls & Associations meeting and also at other community events.	
		It is anticipated that the finalised Compact will be presented to the CEG for approval and adoption in March 2016 and final document to be approved by CP Board in April 2016.	
		The aim is to see communities working together however this can prove difficult but it is what needs to be done. How do we achieve this? Additionally, how do we encourage people to 'enthuse' about the content?	
		(ii) Community Engagement Moray 2023 Fabio advised that this was the first time that consultation had taken place as a partnership and we were engaging with the public together.	
		Despite low numbers attending the events, it is recognised that this is the experience of many agencies and partners when undertaking such events. It is important that we continue to look at other ways of engaging with the public which could also include the use of social media as well as the ongoing day to day work with communities and third sector groups.
