The new form is victim-oriented, in that it allows the victim to report as much or as little as they feel comfortable with, they can remain anonymous, and gives them access to a wide network of support.	Partners

Third party organisations can nominate themselves as contacts for this form, thereby enabling victims to report incidents to an organisation they feel comfortable with. It would also provide a network of support.
